PROGRAM - MAY'S GENERAL MEETING

"REINS Therapeutic Horse Program" was presented to the Bonsall Woman's Club by Executive Director, Debbie Shinner. It was thoroughly enjoyed by all and we learned so much about the program and how it benefits our community. REINS is a local program that works with children and young adults with disabilities.

At REINS, children and adults with disabilities learn how to ride horses. Therapeutic horseback riding benefits almost any disabling condition. The rhythmic motion and warmth of the horse stimulates and exercises the rider's muscles increasing their mobility. The rider experiences weight shift and trunk mobility as if he were walking on his own. As the horse and rider progress through their different gaits, the rider experiences a wide range of sensory input, which makes them becomes more aware of their own body. This therapy also helps to encourage speech by identifying new objects.

REINS is inviting our members to come see the program first hand. Lessons are held Monday thru Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. with a break from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. each day.

- 5. To print or download the document, use the icons in the upper right-hand corner.



The meeting was CALLED TO ORDER at 10:07 A.M. by President Mary Jane Poulter.

The Pledge of Allegiance and singing the Star-Spangled Banner was led by Barbara Chahbazian.

Elaine Davis wrote a May inspirational message that included a quote by Lillian Berliner.

Attendance Report- Judy Bresnahan, Hospitality, reported that we have a quorum.

President's Welcome – Mary Jane Poulter welcomed and introduced guest, Debby Harris, friend of Torrie and Mary Forbess. Mary Jane also told us that a student at the Vivian Banks Charter School lost her home in a fire. The money that is part of the Charitable Donation for the Vivian Banks Charter School, \$500.00 along with monies collected each month for the Presidents Project, \$327.24 were given to the family for clothing and other essential items.

Minutes – General membership minutes from the April 7, 2022, meeting were submitted by Marlene Rantanen, Recording Secretary, as the official record of the meeting. The minutes were distributed through the newsletter prior to the meeting and there were no corrections noted.

Dean – Sydne Gilbert, 1st V.P., Dean of Chairs, reported on the District Convention held on April 26, 2022. She was pleased to report that BWC received certificates in every category for the narratives that were submitted by our members.

Membership – Bev York, 2nd V.P., Membership, introduced and welcomed: Nicky Birchall, Sally Sebeckis, Torrie Forbess and Susan Gill as new members. Gifts, name tags and the BWC yearbook were given to each new member.

Palomar District report from Bev York, 2nd V.P., membership. At the District Convention in the Art Show, "Strutt Your Stuff," BWC submitted over half the items on display and these projects were well received.

Treasurer's Report – Treasurer Helen Poddoubnyi reported that she has revised the books making a ledger system in the Quick Books program that will flow more easily for the clubs bookkeeping. She reconciled the checking at \$30,349.63 savings at \$10,208.64 H&H Lee Savings at \$15,672.11, Income was \$94.70, and Expenses were \$447.40. Notable Income: Angel Benefactor \$1,475.00, Elegant Tea \$8,905.00 and Membership Dues \$843.00.

Ways and Means – Emily Manley, 4th V.P., Ways and Means reported that the fundraiser "An Elegant Tea" is full at 160 seats. The event will be held at the Vista Valley Country Club on May 11, 2022. Miriam Key will emcee the fashion show with clothing from Mimi's Boutique and the inventory from 100 Main Street. Members of our club will be modeling the outfits. The baskets for the Raffle and the teacups that our members will be using at their tables can be taken to the V.V.C.C. on Tuesday, May 10th after 3:00 P.M. reported by Cheri Marie Poulos.

Proposed Budget for a Christmas Fundraiser was presented. Motion was made by Maura Button and 2nd by Cindy Gibson Floyd to accept the budget. All were in favor. Laurie Criscenti and Judy Bresnahan will co-chair the Christmas Fundraiser. A motion was made by Maura Buttons and 2nd by Cindy Gibson Floyd to proceed with the Christmas fundraiser as presented. All were in favor.

Proposed Budget for a Community Service outreach/Art Show (with students) was presented by Elaine David and 2nd by

Marleen DuBona to accept the budget. All were in favor. Patty Merriam will Chair the above started Art Show. A motion was made by Elaine Davis and 2nd by Barbara Chahbazian to proceed with the Art Show. All were in favor.

Correspondence – Mary Jo Pfaff, Corresponding Secretary, reviewed the correspondence received.

Program: Laurie Criscenti introduced Deborah Shinner, Executive Director of REINS, a therapeutic horsemanship program, "Changing Lives One Ride at a Time," for disables children and adults located in Fallbrook. Deborah's program was very informative with heartfelt stories shown in 3 video presentations. After the program, Deborah was presented with a check for \$300.00 as part of the Charitable Donations by President Mary Jane Poulter and Mary Jo Pfaff, Chair of the BWC Charitable Donations Committee.

BREAK -

Bylaws Committee- Patty Merriam, Eileen Davis, Bev York, Marleen DuBona and Parliamentarian ProTem Rosalie Zamora for Marlene Rantanen club Parliamentarian (absent) set forth the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. Patty Merriam presented the changes and then she opened the floor for discussion. There was discussion by several members present at todays meeting. Patti explained the new wording. She then asked for a vote stating that a 2/3 approval would be needed to pass. The vote was 19 adopt to 17 opposed. It became apparent that a new look by the committee was needed so the vote was tabled until next month at the June 2, 2022, BWC meeting. This will give the committee time to consider the objections and write or retain as written the new Bylaws and Proposed Amendment to the Constitution.
