It is so important that we continue to maintain this website which is situated on a Wix, user-friendly, web building platform. The website is a major resource for our members by providing the details about our upcoming events and as a reference tool by providing documents such as our most recent minutes and newsletters. It is also our window to the world as it provides the particulars about our club to possible new members and other interested individuals.

At a minimum the *Home, Dates to Remember, Calendar, Roster, Minutes and Newsletter* pages should be kept up-to-date. To maintain the Home, the Dates to Remember and the Calendar pages, a few tasks are required. New data can be gleaned by attending regular meetings, section meetings and accessing Roadrunner articles on the BWC shared Google drive. New text boxes and decorative shapes (provided by the program) as well as uploaded photos may be added to our Home page to highlight our upcoming activities.

Dates to Remember is simply adding new information to a text box. New dates to the Calendar may be added by duplicating prior entries and then updating the information. The details about each activity must be entered so that our members will have all the specifics needed to attend an event. The recent minutes, a year-long listing of newsletters and the roster are located on pages that only take files in a portable document format (pdf). Once the new files have been uploaded into Wix media, they can be used to update these pages by simply loading a new file onto the page.

This job may seem daunting at first, but Wix has many video tutorials, an editor help center, and Marleen will be available to answer questions and provide transitional assistance.

BWC Visits the Little Old Bonsall School House





During the recent Open House at the Little Old Bonsall School House (LOBSH), accolades were heard in profusion for BWC's generous donations to the restoration project. Members who accepted the invitation from the Bonsall Education Foundation viewed first-hand what has been accomplished with BWC support.

Rescued from being a sinking vessel into the ground to now being a beautiful "queen" sitting where she can be seen from Old River Road is an awesome accomplishment. The time frame has spanned several years, but is now nearing the time when COMPLETED can be the sign hung on the door!

Jennifer Leung, director of the Bonsall Schoolhouse Restoration Project, spoke in loving detail about "her baby" and the time, effort and concern she has spent in bringing the awesome results to fruition. Jen explained how BWC funds have been spent on lead and asbestos abatement, the monitoring of this abatement by a third party, complete window restoration, exterior painting, roofing repairs, termite abatement, rebuilding of outside skirt and miscellaneous carpentry, new rear door and installation, repair, painting and rehanging of front doors, rebuilding crawl space openings, rock fascia installation on foundation, rebuilding and repairing of all interior walls with milled bead board, interior floor repair/refinishing, interior paint and replacement of chalkboards.

The bell tower and front steps remain to be completed, but plans are underway for both. Retrieving the original bell from the new Bonsall Elementary School to its rightful place atop the LOBSH is a high priority!

REPORTS:

2nd Vice President Co-Membership Bev York and Cindy Gibson Floyd: Bev and Cindy welcomed our guests. They will be calling those who have not renewed their annual dues.

3rd Vice President Programs Emily Manley and Frances Pyle: Today the Fallbrook Historical Society will present information on the history of early trains in the Fallbrook area. The May meeting will have "Wings of Change," on butter-flies
