APRIL Program "Fallbrook Historical Society"

Presentation by the Fallbrook Historical Society will Highlight Trains for the April Program. Ever wonder why there is a vintage Santa Fe passenger train on Main Street in Fallbrook? Thanks to Jeff Duhachek, vice president of the Fallbrook Historical Society, we will learn all about the importance of this train and the railroad when Jeff presents the program for the April meeting.

Jeff will present a slideshow of early Fallbrook, showing how the railroad was a catalyst for economic growth in the past, and how it supports local businesses as a tourist attraction. Many of Jeff's photos will show the sheriff's station, Cates Hotel, Reche Schoolhouse, Pittenger House, and the railroad tracks down Main Street.

Included in the history of the train is the importance to agriculture. Fallbrook weather was conducive to growing olives, oranges, lemons and avocados. The problem arose on how to efficiently market thousands of pounds of these fruits to other states. The railroads knew they could make a profit AND help the farmers. Soon, the tracks extended from San Bernardino and Los Angeles to Fallbrook.

When the railroad built passenger trains for tourists, freight, cattle and special trains for all the delicate fruit, Fallbrook thrived! Our "Friendly Village" was born and we became the Avocado Capital of the U.S.

Plan to attend the April meeting to hear more about the importance of the railroad!



"Stages of Inspiration" a HUGE SUCCESS!

When the doors opened for the 2023 BWC/BUSD Art Contest and Show on March 7, BWC members, students and their families, and BUSD staff found a venue filled with 197 entries in three categories: fine arts, crafts, and photography.

In addition to the art, this inaugural show also featured student performances by guitarist Jeff Van Alfen and Ballet Folklorico groups from Vivian Banks Charter School, Bonsall West Elementary School, Sullivan Middle School and Bonsall High School.



Hundreds of people filled the Sullivan Middle School multipurpose room to view and judge the

art during the first hour of the program, while Van Alfen played background music on his guitar. The audience was then entertained with Ballet Folklorico performances while the ballots were being tallied.

When all was said and done, 29 prize bags filled with art supplies were awarded to students for first through third place, in all grades (K-12).

In addition to the prize bags, the following free door prizes were handed out to students: six canvas bags of art supplies, 12 Nessy Burgers gift certificates, one Fallbrook Art Center family membership, and one \$25 gift certificate for a purchase in the Fallbrook Art Center's gallery store, "The Find," or a discount from any show at the Art Center.


