
President's Message

Membership Matters!

Your Badge! As a new member, receiving your badge signifies your official membership. Wear it proudly!

The proper placement is on the upper right side of your body.

Members wear green badges, and elected officers wear white badges with their office name displayed. Appointed officers wear their green badges with a supplemental white badge with their appointed office (i.e. Corresponding Secretary, Parliamentarian, and Finance Budget Secretary) displayed. Appointed Chairs to the Board wear their green badge.

If you have a pacemaker, please inform Membership, and they will provide you with a badge with a pin back to avoid magnetic interference.

In case your badge goes missing, you can reorder a replacement badge from Membership for \$7.00.

If you forget your badge at general meetings - it happens. Hospitality will collect \$1.00 from any member not wearing her badge! (Standing Rule #3).

When you receive your service year pins, you can drill a little hole in a corner of the name badge to display it. If you have multiple pins, you can purchase a ribbon from the GFWC website or simply wear your service year pin next to your badge.

Wear your badge when attending events and feel free to mention that you are with Bonsall Woman's Club. It's a great opportunity to share your pride in being a part of BWC and how membership matters!!

BWC: LOOKING BACK 45 YEARS By Bev York

We are celebrating BWC's upcoming 45th birthday in February 2025 with a look back at some of the special recipes in the 2000 edition of the Bonsall Woman's Club Cookbook and the special ladies who contributed

them. This month our spotlight is on June Bernesser, who joined BWC in 1986.

After graduating from high school in 1956, she enrolled at UCLA where tuition was \$50 per semester. Not satisfied there, she enrolled in business college in Santa Monica and began a 19-year secretarial career in the aerospace field, advancing to Executive Secretary at Hughes Aircraft and Xerox Electro-Optical Systems, and to the owners of Analog Technology Corporation. She went back to school, received her AA degree at Mount San Antonio College and two years later graduated from skills to create and develop BWC's first website, publish California Polytechnic University in Pomona with a Bachelor of Science degree in Communications Arts/ Public Relations. Tuition was \$42 per quarter.

Hired by the Los Angeles chapter of the Arthritis Foundation, she worked her way up to Communications Director and photographer for the "Stop Arthritis" telethons. She started her own home-based business to provide word processing and editing services to highly motivated clients – including women working on their other lakes nearby. dissertations to earn a doctorate in education.

She met her future husband Ralph "out of a clear blue sky" in 1984 and married him in Las Vegas a few months

later. They soon retired – at the ages of 55 and 48 – and immediately began building Ralph's dream home on top of a hill in Valley Center overlooking their avocado farm. When the home was completed a year later, they caught the travel bug and bought a motorhome. They eventually traveled all over the US, Canada, and Mexico, but their favorite destination was the June Lake Loop in the Sierras, where they enjoyed camping and fishing with friends.

Between home-building and travel, June joined two nonprofit groups that she came to love: Bonsall Woman's Club and Dos Valley Garden Club. She joined BWC primarily for its bridge group but immediately became involved with the Bonsall Bargain Bonanza fundraiser and headed up the rummage sale event. She organized bus trips to Getty Museum and the Botanical Gardens, among others. She served for many years on boards in various positions, joyfully using her communications the newsletter and serve as photographer for the club, taking thousands of club photos.

She still has "plenty of bounce in her steps" and loves to greet guests and sell raffle tickets at BWC fundraisers. She still plays bridge and Mah Jong and tends her avocado grove. She's "not done yet by a long shot" and looks forward to returning in May 2025 to her favorite fishing spots in the Sierras - the June Lake Loop and

Albondigas Soup

Ingredients:

3 lbs. Ground beef

1/4 cup Mint leaves, chopped (fresh or dried)

4 Tbsp. Rice, cooked

3 tsp. Flour
1 Egg
2 tsp. Salt
2 Tbsp. Oil

Onions, diced, not too small
Carrots, cut in 1/2" pieces
Stalks Celery, slice in 1/2" pieces
Tomatoes, chopped, fresh

1 tsp. Garlic, minced

1 tsp. Mexican oregano, chopped (fresh or dried)

6 cups Hot water

14-oz can Tomatoes, chopped6 tsp Chicken base (or to taste)



Directions:

Combine the first six ingredients and form into balls about the size of walnuts. Heat oil in saucepan and sauté onions, carrots, celery, fresh tomatoes, and garlic for about 5 minutes. Add oregano, water, canned tomatoes, and chicken base. Bring it to boil. Add meatballs and cook for about 10 minutes or until vegetables are tender firm and meatballs cooked. Serves 6.


We also thank everyone who signed up to do the refresh-
